

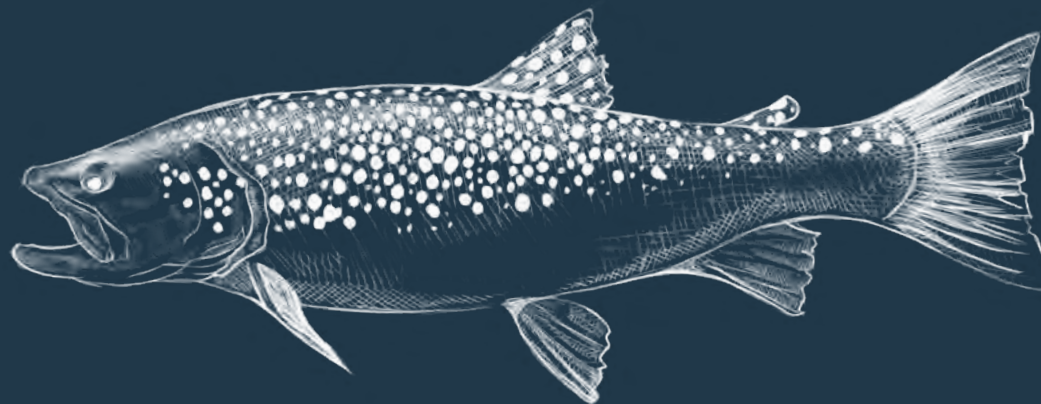

FUTA LODGE

The Magic Valley

Across the border from Esquel, Argentina and deep in the Coihue Forest of the Tenth Region of Chile, flows the deep blue of the Futaleufú River. A world away from the hustle and bustle that even sleepy Esquel represents, the “Big River” (Futaleufú’s translation from the native Tehuelche tongue) rolls along amid some of the most unspoiled mountain scenery on the planet.

South of the Chilean Lake District, Futaleufú is a standalone fishery. This giant river grows healthy numbers of Rainbow and Brown Trout that are fed by abundant hatches of Mayfly, Caddis, and Stoneflies. An abundant resident stock of fish and great hatches combined with classic fly water make the Futaleufú a trout fisherman’s paradise!

Beyond the fishing, Futa Lodge is equally ideal for non-anglers and family groups, offering a wide range of activities immersed in nature. From scenic trekking and horseback riding to rafting and sightseeing, there is truly something for everyone to enjoy.

The charm of a bygone era, paired with a rustic yet refined setting nestled along a gin-clear river, invites guests to slow down and explore at their own pace. Whether wandering through the fruit garden in the backyard, taking in the structural beauty of the river itself, or enjoying panoramic views of the interlocking hills from horseback—it’s entirely up to you.

In short, Futa offers a wholesome, deeply organic experience where world-class fishing is only one part of a far richer Patagonian escape.

Set within a 250-acre private ranch along the magnificent Futaleufú River, at the edge of the Andes Mountains, Futa Lodge offers a refined yet authentic Patagonian experience.



FACILITIES AND SERVICES

Welcome to your remote and relaxing riverfront home in the Valle de las Escalas region of Chilean Patagonia. Our lodge accommodates up to 8 guests (6 anglers and 2 non-anglers), ensuring an intimate and personalized experience. There are three bright and comfortable cottages—one located beside the main lodge and the others set along the river's edge, offering beautiful views and a true connection to the surrounding landscape.

The main lodge features a warm and inviting living room with a fireplace, along with an additional double room, creating a cozy and welcoming space to unwind after a day outdoors.

- Capacity: 6 anglers and 2 non-anglers (8 guests total)
- Accommodations: 4 rooms in total: two riverside wooden cabins located just steps from the river, each with two queen beds, private bathroom, and wood-burning stove, one cottage next to the main lodge with a king bed, private bathroom, and wood-burning stove & one double room upstairs in the main lodge, featuring a private bathroom and wood-burning stove
- Professional guides, both local and international—English-speaking and highly experienced in casting instruction
- Rafts with swivel seats and 4WD vehicles for all daily transfers
- Full open bar with local spirits, beer, and a curated selection of some of the best Chilean wines
- A la carte menu consisting on a concept of Fresh, farm-to-table cuisine prepared daily using the finest local ingredients
- Outdoor wooden hot tub overlooking the river
- Multiple outdoor dining settings and fire pit areas, offering varied experiences—from garden lunches to open-fire asados and evenings under the stars
- Daily housekeeping and laundry service
- Wi-Fi available



Futa Lodge can host up to 8 guests across four accommodations, including two riverside cabins, a private cottage, and a room in the main lodge—all with private bathrooms and wood-burning stoves.





FARM TO TABLE

At Futa Lodge, cuisine is shaped by the wild character of Southern Patagonia, where rivers, forests, and mountains define both the setting and the table. Rooted in a true farm-to-table philosophy, our kitchen works closely with local producers while also drawing directly from our own green garden, ensuring fresh, seasonal ingredients in every dish. Much of what is served is produced right at the lodge—from carefully sourced meats to vegetables from the garden and eggs from our own chicken coop. Our daily à la carte menu reflects this approach, built around fresh, farm-to-table cuisine prepared each day using the finest local ingredients. Fire plays a central role in the experience, where red meats, Patagonian lamb, and local vegetables are prepared over open flames, honoring both tradition and simplicity. This is complemented by a thoughtful selection of some of the best Chilean wines and a refined offering of gourmet desserts, bringing balance and creativity to each meal.

Futa Lodge offers multiple outdoor dining settings and fire pit areas, where this connection to the land becomes part of the experience itself. From relaxed lunches in the garden to open-fire asados and intimate evenings under the stars, guests are immersed in a setting where ingredients, surroundings, and atmosphere come together—creating shared moments to unwind after a day on the river or in the mountains, and to connect through honest food, warm hospitality, and a deep sense of place.



THE FISHING

In a world that is increasingly overexposed, Futa Lodge has managed to retain a sense of mystery—remaining one of those rare insider secrets among seasoned South American anglers. To describe the experience here as simply “great trout fishing” would be an understatement. Those who arrive with fishing as their sole focus often leave with something far more meaningful: a deeper connection to the place, the water, and the rhythm of Patagonia itself.

Fishing at Futa Lodge is defined by variety—of water, technique, and experience—set against one of Patagonia’s most pristine river systems. Centered around wild Brown and Rainbow Trout, the fishery offers a compelling mix of technical challenges and visual rewards, where the quality of each moment on the water often matters more than the number of fish landed. The crystal-clear flows of the Futaleufú River and its tributaries create ideal conditions for diverse and prolific insect life, leading to consistent hatches and frequent opportunities to fish dry flies to rising trout. For anglers who appreciate the precision of “match-the-hatch” fishing, this can be some of the most engaging water anywhere, particularly during warm summer evenings when heavy falls of spent insects often trigger sustained feeding activity and memorable surface action.

Beyond classic dry fly fishing, the range of techniques keeps each day dynamic. Terrestrial patterns—grasshoppers, beetles, and other land-based insects—become especially important in late summer, often drawing aggressive takes from larger fish. Subsurface methods also play a key role, with nymphs, streamers, and sinking lines used to probe deeper runs, structure, and seams where bigger trout tend to hold. On smaller streams, hopper-dropper rigs offer a productive and visual approach, while the main river rewards a more deliberate strategy, combining drifting and wading to cover prime water. Sight fishing is often part of the experience, with fish visible in the river’s remarkably clear currents.



Most of the fishing is done through float trips on rafts, although wading opportunities are also available. Both brown and rainbow trout are the primary target species.

The Futaleufú is a big river, and the right way to fish it is by floating. That said, this is not a “cover miles” program—you’re not drifting 12 or 15 miles a day. More often, it’s half that, focusing on shorter sections where long back eddies, seams, and structure demand time and attention. A full day can easily be spent working just a few miles well. There’s a good mix of smooth water, riffles, and the occasional push of whitewater, with opportunities to step out and wade gravel bars when it makes sense. Over the course of a week, the fishable stretches of the river offer several full days of float fishing, depending on water levels.

What stands out as much as the fishing itself is the setting. You’re moving through wild country—very little development, few houses, and rarely another angler. The water clarity is exceptional; on the right light, it’s possible to see fish deep in the system, and in flatter sections you’ll spot trout throughout the day.

Nearby creeks and lakes provide additional variety, and the water in front of the lodge allows for easy early or late sessions. This is not a numbers-driven fishery, but one built around fishing well in a place that hasn’t been overworked. Operating under a strict catch-and-release policy, Futa Lodge preserves both the integrity of its fishery and the experience itself.

What really defines Futa is the sense of stepping back in time—fishing water that feels untouched, where the experience becomes part of something bigger than just the fishing.

THE FUTA EXPERIENCE — FOR FAMILIES & NON-ANGLERS

While fishing is at the heart of the experience, Futaleufú offers a wide range of outdoor adventures that perfectly complement your time on the water. Whether traveling as a couple, with family, or with friends, these activities provide different ways to explore Patagonia—blending adrenaline, relaxation, and a deep connection with nature.

TREKKING / HIKING

For those who enjoy exploring on foot, trekking and hiking offer options for all levels—from short scenic walks (approximately 1 hour) to more demanding routes leading to lagoons, viewpoints, and untouched landscapes (ranging from 3 to 8 hours). It's the perfect complement to fishing, allowing you to fully immerse yourself in Patagonia's natural beauty.

HORSEBACK RIDING AND/OR CANYONING

For a quieter pace, horseback riding offers a unique way to explore hidden trails, native forests, and scenic viewpoints—an authentic Patagonian experience that connects you with the landscape and local culture. For those seeking more adrenaline, canyoning combines hiking, climbing, and waterfall descents in a nearby canyon, creating a playful and immersive adventure in the heart of nature.

CITY TOUR

A guided visit to the town of Futaleufú, nestled between mountains and rivers, offers insight into the region's culture, history, and daily life, along with access to iconic viewpoints and local highlights. Duration: approximately half day (4 hours).

RAFTING / FLOATING

For those looking to experience the power of the river beyond fishing, rafting on the Futaleufú is a must. Widely regarded as one of the best rivers in the world, it offers everything from scenic, mellow sections to full-day, adrenaline-filled runs through turquoise waters and dramatic landscapes. For a more relaxed option, a family float provides a slower-paced experience, with calm waters, stunning scenery, and a safe environment ideal for families with teenagers (minimum age 14) and beginners.

KAYAKING

For a more hands-on adventure, duckies (individual inflatable kayaks) allow you to navigate the river or lake yourself. It's a fun and dynamic way to engage with the water—perfect for couples, groups of friends, families with teenagers, or anyone seeking a bit more independence and excitement.

CANOPY (ZIPLINE)

Canopy is a great way to add a dose of fun and excitement, gliding through native forests with panoramic views. Safe and accessible, it's an ideal shared experience. Located just 10 minutes from the town of Futaleufú, the course features six zip lines of varying lengths, heights, and speeds, totaling over 700 meters. It is suitable for both children (minimum age 12) and adults, combining adrenaline, fun, and a connection with nature in a safe environment.

These experiences are designed to complement your fishing program, creating a well-rounded and unforgettable stay in Patagonia.

DAILY ITINERARY

Fishing schedules at Futa Lodge vary throughout the season, adapting to daylight hours, weather, and river conditions. A hearty breakfast is typically served around 7:00 a.m., with each day’s plan tailored to make the most of the fishing.

On days when we fish stretches close to the lodge, guests usually return for lunch and a short siesta before heading back out to the river around 4:00 p.m. When fishing farther sections, lunch is often served riverside, followed by a continued afternoon session, with departure from the take-out generally around 5:00 p.m.

Fishing hours naturally shift with the time of year, but the program remains flexible. For those who want to make the most of every moment on the water, full-day sessions can be arranged with the head guide.

Beyond fishing, a range of activities is available for guests who wish to explore more of the area. Horseback riding, trekking, canoeing, and other excursions offer a chance to experience the landscape, wildlife, and pace of Patagonia from a different perspective. These can be arranged in advance or directly at the lodge with the house managers.

Futa Lodge operates with a flexible approach, allowing each guest to shape their days on the water—and off it—according to their preferences.



ANGLERS PROGRAM

5 nights & 4 days fishing

- **Day 1 – Arrival at Futa Lodge:** Arrival in the early afternoon, welcome drink, and check-in. Time to organize gear and meet the head guide for a program overview. Appetizers and dinner at the lodge.
- **Day 2 – Full Day Fishing:** Morning float or wade session. Lunch at the lodge or riverside. Afternoon session on a different section.
- **Day 3 – Full Day Fishing:** Explore new water by raft. Riverside lunch followed by an afternoon session.
- **Day 4 – Full Day Fishing:** Continue exploring different sections combining floating and wading. Lunch by the river.
- **Day 5 – Final Fishing Day:** Flexible program tailored to preferences, based on conditions and goals.
- **Day 6 – Departure:** Departure after breakfast.

Program Overview: The program adapts to river conditions, weather, and guest preferences. Programs range from 5 nights / 4 fishing days up to 7 nights / 6 fishing days, with optional early or late sessions. Fishing focuses on the Futaleufú River (four sections), with additional options on the Espolón River, Río Azul, and Lonconao and Espolón Lakes. The Río Grande (Argentine side) may also be available depending on conditions.



RIVERS & WILDERNESS EXPERIENCE

6 nights & 5 days

- **Day 1 – Arrival at Futa Lodge:** Arrival, welcome drink, program overview, and relaxed dinner at the lodge.
- **Day 2 – Fishing Day:** Introduction to the river with a guided float session.
- **Day 3 – Rafting | Futaleufú River:** Half-day rafting experience in the morning. Return to the lodge for lunch and a free afternoon to relax or explore.
- **Day 4 – Trekking / Hiking:** Half-day guided hike in the morning. Return to the lodge for lunch and a free afternoon.
- **Day 5 – Horseback Riding:** Half-day horseback ride through the wilderness with a picnic. Flexible timing in the morning or early afternoon.
- **Day 6 – Flexible Day:** Mix of fishing, relaxation, or additional activities such as kayaking, canopy, town visits, or short hikes.
- **Day 7 – Departure:** Departure after breakfast

Program Overview: A balanced program combining time on the water with a variety of outdoor experiences, including a range of trekking, hiking, and horseback riding options tailored to each guest’s level and preferences, allowing exploration of Patagonia at a relaxed pace.



We also offer highly personalized non-angling experience packages, ranging from 7 nights to 3 nights. These programs can be fully customized on a daily basis to suit each group’s interests and preferences.



LOCATION

Futa Lodge is set in the Valle de Las Escalas along the renowned Futaleufú River in Chile’s Tenth Region, a place defined by dramatic Andean landscapes and some of the world’s most ancient temperate rainforests. Perched on a high riverbank within a private ranch, the lodge overlooks clear, rushing waters and a lush, untouched environment rich in wildlife. Hidden from the pace of mainstream tourism, this secluded valley offers a sense of stepping back in time—where life moves slower, days are shaped by the rhythm of the river, and evenings are best enjoyed by the fire with a glass of wine as trout quietly rise in the fading light.

GETTING THERE

While it may sound counterintuitive, the most efficient and reliable way to reach Futa Lodge is via Argentina.

- **VIA ARGENTINA (Recommended):** Guests typically fly into Buenos Aires—either Ezeiza International Airport (EZE) or Jorge Newbery Domestic Airport (AEP)—and spend the night in the city. The following day, they take a short domestic flight (approximately 2 hours and 15 minutes) from AEP to Esquel (EQS). Upon arrival in Esquel, a lodge representative will meet you for a scenic transfer to Futa Lodge. The drive takes roughly two hours and includes a smooth border crossing into Chile before the final stretch to the lodge.
- **VIA CHILE:** Guests traveling through Chile will fly from Santiago (SCL) to Chaitén Airport (WCH), typically connecting through Puerto Montt (PMC). Upon arrival in Chaitén, a lodge representative will greet you and transfer you to the lodge. The drive is approximately 3.5 hours and offers stunning views of Patagonia along the way.
- **PRIVATE CHARTER OPTION:** For a faster and more direct route within Chile, private charter flights are available from Puerto Montt to Futaleufú Airport. From Futaleufú, a lodge representative will meet you for a short 25-minute transfer to Futa Lodge.
